Over 8,000 people have signed the petition started by the cardiac charity SADS UK.

The Service's Community Defibrillation Officer Martin Bullock, who went to Downing Street, said: "Defibrillators should be in every public building, including all schools. In 2011 in London, 56 people died from a fire compared to 10,000 people who suffered an out-of-hospital cardiac arrest, yet fire extinguishers are statutory and defibrillators are not."
