



Year One – Ages 5-6

Learning objectives

The children will learn:

- What an emergency service is
- Who works for the London Ambulance Service and we do
- How you get in touch with the ambulance service
- How to call for help – who is a safe person to ask for help

Pre-learning:

- What is my home address?
- What is my mum or dad's name?

Activities:

Dialing 999

- Use toy phones and get the children to show you how to make a call to the emergency services. The children could role play with you. You could be the call taker and they could be ringing for help.
- Encourage them to learn their address and know their family's names.

Game

- Use a large area (school gym if available).
- Create three flash cards marked with 999, Teacher and Adult
- Hand a card to three teachers get them to stand at 3 corners with the pupils in the middle.
- Explain to the pupils that you are going to tell them a situation and when you have finished they have to run to the card that they think is most relevant, whether they should tell an adult, a teacher or call 999 if there is no one around. E.g. your friend has fallen over in the playground and grazed her knee, you are at home and you have found you mum collapsed on the floor.
- See where the children ran and correct them by getting the children in the wrong areas to the correct ones.

Drawing

- Draw a picture of an ambulance
